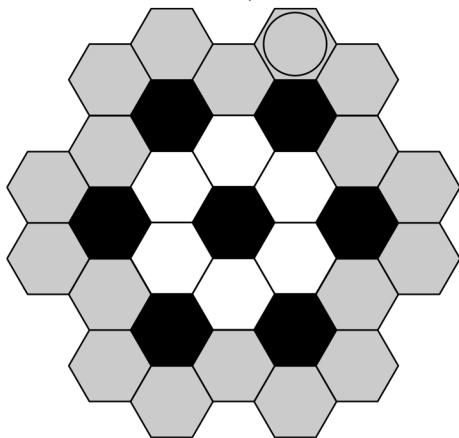
Solution to Keep On....:

Each line between Celia and Brad contains a reference to a standard CB call code 10-#, hinted at by Ceilia and Brad's initials. The title also hints at the phrase "Keep on trucking."

"My location is Main and Vine." = 10-20, "Could you relay message for me?" = 10-5, "Receiving poorly." = 10-1, "Advise weather." = 10-13, "Nothing for you, return to base." = 10-19, "My location is near you." = 10-20, "Could you relay message for me?" = 10-5, "Anything for us?" = 10-18

Index into the alphabet using each CB code to get the final answer TEAMSTER.
